

HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR ABSTRACT TO PEERJ FOR BITS2016 COLLECTION

The Scientific Committee of BITS2016 has made an arrangement to create a themed 'proceedings' Collection at PeerJ. PeerJ is a respected open access publisher in the biological and medical sciences, and more information about them can be found at: <https://peerj.com/about/publications/>. PeerJ publishes an un-peer reviewed preprint server "PeerJ Preprints" (which covers all of computer science, biology, medicine and is able to post materials within ~24 hours). The PeerJ journal peer-reviews only for scientific and methodological soundness, and they currently get first decisions back to authors in a median of 26 days.

The Collection is able to contain your accepted Abstracts and any peer-reviewed journal publications which may result from the meeting. Initially, we encourage you to submit your accepted Abstracts to PeerJ Preprints. The instructions for doing so are below.

We kindly ask you to submit your abstract to PeerJ BITS2016 Meeting Collection no later than July 1, 2016.

Instructions to submit a Preprint: PLEASE READ CAREFULLY.

- 1) Create a free account in PeerJ at <https://peerj.com/signup/> and follow the steps to activate your account;
- 2) Once your account is activated, click "My Manuscripts" and "Submit Article" (or click on <https://peerj.com/manuscripts/start/>);
- 3.1) Start the submission by choosing "Life, Biological and Health Sciences" as the research area;
- 3.2) Check the Preprint author guidelines (<https://peerj.com/about/preprints/scope-and-instructions/>);
- 3.3) Choose "Preprint" as article type;
- 4) Start your submission and follow the steps;
- 5) In the first submission screen there is a "Comments from the Author" field – please include the following text in this field: "This is an abstract which has been accepted for the BITS2016 Meeting" (for abstracts);

6) The first submission screen asks you to input the abstract text. For Abstracts, this should be the same abstract text which is present in the PDF of your accepted abstract;

7) There is a "Notes for PeerJ Staff" field – in that field you should also include the following text: "This is an abstract which has been accepted for the BITS2016 Meeting"

8) At the final submission step you should upload a PDF of your abstract. This document should include the title of the submission and full author names and affiliations. The text in that PDF should be the same as the information previously entered into the system.

We also encourage you to consider submitting the 'full' journal articles which result from your research to PeerJ. In that instance, PeerJ's normal publication fees will apply (see <https://peerj.com/pricing/>). Once your Abstract is online, you will have the option to take the same information and use it to create a peer-reviewed submission (PeerJ will send you instructions as to how to do so in their confirmation email). Going this route means will mean you don't have to re-enter metadata.

You can submit your journal articles at any time before or after the conference, and they will be published as and when they are accepted. Any articles which pass their peer-review and go on to be published in PeerJ will then also appear in the Collection These articles will also appear in our Collection page.
